Originally academic building called College Edifice for Hanover College. Built in 1832. Hanover College transferred deed of College Edifice and land to Hanover Presbyterian Church during the 1850's-1860's. Building renovations occurred in 1871. Construction removed second story, replaced south facade, and installed steeple.
PH6_Box1_F1_P1_2	Hanover College Campus From Across Crowe Ravine	1900-1910	Photograph of the Hanover College campus including College Point House, the President's House, and Old Classic Hall from across the valley also known as Crowe Ravine.
PH6_Box1_F1_P1_3	Bridge Into Waters of Ohio River	1900-1910	Photograph of a wooden bridge or track leading into the waters of the Ohio River. Man crouches on the bridge. Trees border the edge of the water.
PH6_Box1_F1_P2_1	Back Side of Old Science Hall at Hanover College	1897-1910	Photograph of the back side of Old Science Hall at Hanover College. Built in 1897. Held the President's office and chemistry classrooms on 1st floor, physics and geology classrooms on 2nd floor, and biology classrooms on 3rd floor. Burnt on January 1, 1919. Rebuilt and completed by 1921. Building razed in 1947.
PH6_Box1_F1_P2_2	Old Science Hall at Hanover College During Construction	1900-1910	Photograph of the back side of Old Science Hall at Hanover College during construction. Built in 1897. Held the President's office and chemistry classrooms on 1st floor, physics and geology classrooms on 2nd floor, and biology classrooms on 3rd floor. Burnt on January 1, 1919. Rebuilt and completed by 1921. Building razed in 1947.

Held the President's office and chemistry classrooms on 1st floor, physics and geology classrooms on 2nd floor, and biology classrooms on 3rd floor. Burnt on January 1, 1919. Rebuilt and completed by 1921. Photograph prior to fire. Possibly taken on the roof of the President's House.

PH6_Box1_F1_P3_2	Aerial View of Hendricks Library at Hanover College	1900-1910	Aerial photograph of Hendricks Library at Hanover College. Built in 1903 as gift from Mrs. Eliza C. Hendricks, wife of Thomas A. Hendricks. Thomas A. Hendricks graduated from Hanover College in 1840 and was the 16th governor of Indiana from 1873-1877 and vice president of the United States under Grover Cleveland in 1885. New library built in 1952 replacing Hendricks. Used for classrooms. Remodeled in 2004. Historic building. Possibly taken on the roof of Old Classic Hall.
PH6_Box1_F1_P3_3	Front Side of Old Classic Hall at Hanover College	1900-1910	Photograph of front of Old Classic Hall at Hanover College. Construction began in 1853 and completed in 1857. Originally called College Building. Building consisted of 'center building...with lateral and transverse wings' containing 'corridors, four literary society halls, libraries, lecture and recitation rooms, and chapel.' Renamed Classic Hall on June 5, 1900 by the Board of Trustees. Building destroyed in fire on December 19, 1941, shortly after the bombing of Pearl Harbor. PH6_Box1_F1_P7_4	President's House at Hanover College	1900-1910	Photograph of the first president's house. Built in 1876 by President Heckman, the 9th president of Hanover College. House was razed in 1951. New house for the president built on same land.
PH6_Box1_F1_P7_5	Man Standing Underneath Rocky Cliff	1900-1910	Photograph of a man standing underneath a rocky cliff. Possibly a Hanover College student.
PH6_Box1_F1_P8_1	Observatory at Hanover College	1890-1910	Photograph of the first observatory at Hanover College. Built in 1889. Contained classroom, telescope, Transit instrument, Howard Astronomical clock, sextants, and spectroscope. Culbertson Observatory built in 1992 replacing original observatory. Used dome and telescope from original. Writing on front of photograph reads "Observatory".
PH6_Box1_F1_P8_2	YMCA Building at Hanover College	1883	Photograph of the YMCA building. YMCA organized on Hanover Campus in 1870. Building built in 1883. Dedicated on June 13, 1883. First YMCA building built on a college campus in the world. Moved from its original location in 1962. Used as YMCA meeting place, church, theater, gathering place, and storage center since then. Renovated in 2010 and used as classroom. Writing on front of photograph reads "1883".
PH6_Box1_F1_P8_3	Old Science Hall at Hanover College After Fire	1919-1920	Photograph of Old Science Hall at Hanover College after the first fire. Built in 1897. Held the President's office and chemistry classrooms on 1st floor, physics and geology classrooms on 2nd floor, and biology classrooms on 3rd floor. Burnt on January 1, 1919. Rebuilt and completed by 1921. Building razed in 1947.
