Often we walked to the Presbyterian church in Hanover for Sunday services. Quite a few of the faculty and their families were members there and participated as ushers, readers, choir members and Sunday school teachers.

Sunday lunch was formal both in Donner Hall cafeteria and our sorority house. Women were required to wear Sunday dresses, hose and heels. NEVER slacks! Men had to wear jackets and ties. I don't recall any special foods on Sundays.

After lunch we gathered and talked, walked around campus or down to the river, or took a nap. It seems there was no Sunday dinner served so we either had snacks, made Mac and cheese in electric popcorn poppers or grabbed something at the Cabin.

Around 7:00 pm many of us went to the library to catch up on reading and prepare for the week ahead. Women left by 9:45 as we had to be back in our living units by 10:00 pm. The Sandwich Man made rounds of dorms after closing in case anyone wanted to buy a hamburger!

We had very restrictive rules and procedures but we followed them pretty much without question and were happy. Times were changing rapidly during those years in the late '60's.

This is my contribution to the "One Day in May" project, which preserves the everyday experiences of Hanoverians on an ordinary spring day (in this case, May 15, 2022).
