Hanover College was founded in 1827 by John Finley Crowe, a Presbyterian minister, in southern Indiana as a Presbyterian Seminary. The college was the first private college in the state of Indiana.

Cullen Bryant Barnes attended Hanover College from 1913-1914. He was a Phi Delta Theta during his time at the college.
