Historical Information

Hanover College was founded in 1827 by John Finley Crowe, a Presbyterian minister, in southern Indiana as a Presbyterian Seminary. The college was the first private college in the state of Indiana.

H. Wagner was connected with the 12th president of Hanover College Albert Parker, serving from 1929-1958. He was from Germany.

OV_Box8_FF9	Old Classic Hall at Hanover College	Photograph of Old Classic Hall. Construction began in 1853 and completed in 1857. Originally called College Building. Building consisted of 'center building...with lateral and transverse wings' containing 'corridors, four literary society halls, libraries, lecture and recitation rooms, and chapel.' Renamed Classic Hall on June 5, 1900 by the Board of Trustees. Building destroyed in fire on December 19, 1941, shortly after the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Last event in building was the last chapel service before Christmas vacation on December 18. Writing on back reads "Mr. Albert George Parker, Hanover College, uberreicht in Erinnerung an Hannover/Deutschland." and "hannover den A. Marz 1936." Dr. Albert George Parker was the 12th president of Hanover College from 1929-1958.	1936	Print, Photographic
