Scope and Content Note

Diaries, correspondence, photographs, and newspaper clippings written or collected by Lieutenant Don Watters during his military service in World War II, 1942-1946. The collection focuses on Watter's observations regarding military life, basic training, postwar clean up, German soldiers, the atomic bomb and the death of Adolph Hitler.

Historical Information

Don Albert Watters was born 21 December 1912 in Ravenna, Ohio to Albert Edward Watters and Florence A. (Gray) Watters. He earned a B.A. from Hiram College, an M.A. from the University of North Carolina, and a Ph.D. from Ohio State University. Dr. Watters taught Speech and Theatre at Hanover College from 1937-1962. During World War II, he served in the military beginning in 1942, and was sent to Europe from 1944-1946. Dr. Watters was married to Mollie Jean Dorsey on 29 May 1942 in Kokomo, Indiana. Don Watters died in New York on 13 October 1968.
