## **Scope and Content Note**

The William O. McLelland collection contains photographs in a leather-bound scrapbook. Photographs were collected by William O. McLelland, a 1906 graduate of Hanover College. Topics include students, buildings, student activities and groups, family and friends, and scenic views from Hanover College and Hanover and Madison, Jefferson County, Indiana.

#### **Historical Information**

Hanover College was founded in 1827 by John Finley Crowe, a Presbyterian minister, in southern Indiana as a Presbyterian Seminary. The college was the first private college in the state of Indiana.

William Oliver McLelland was a graduate of Hanover College in 1906. His sister Harriett Graham McLelland attended and graduated from Hanover College at the same time. Their family resided in Madison, Indiana. William was a member of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity.
