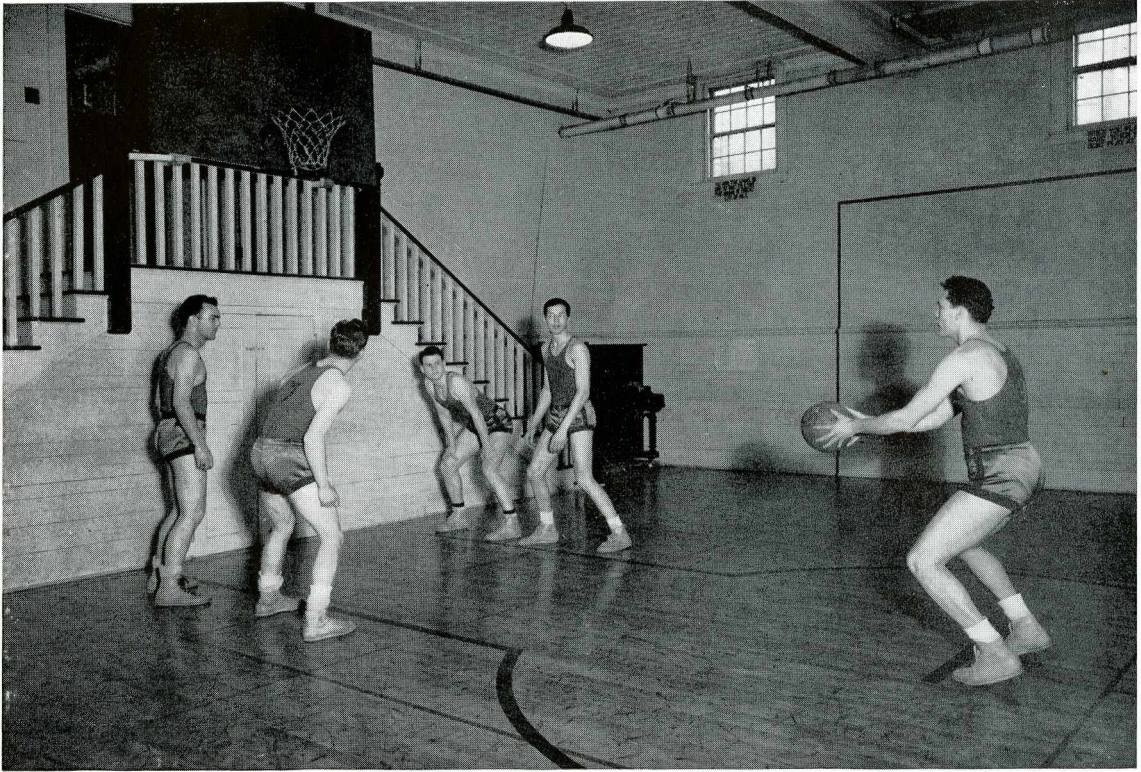


Representative Students

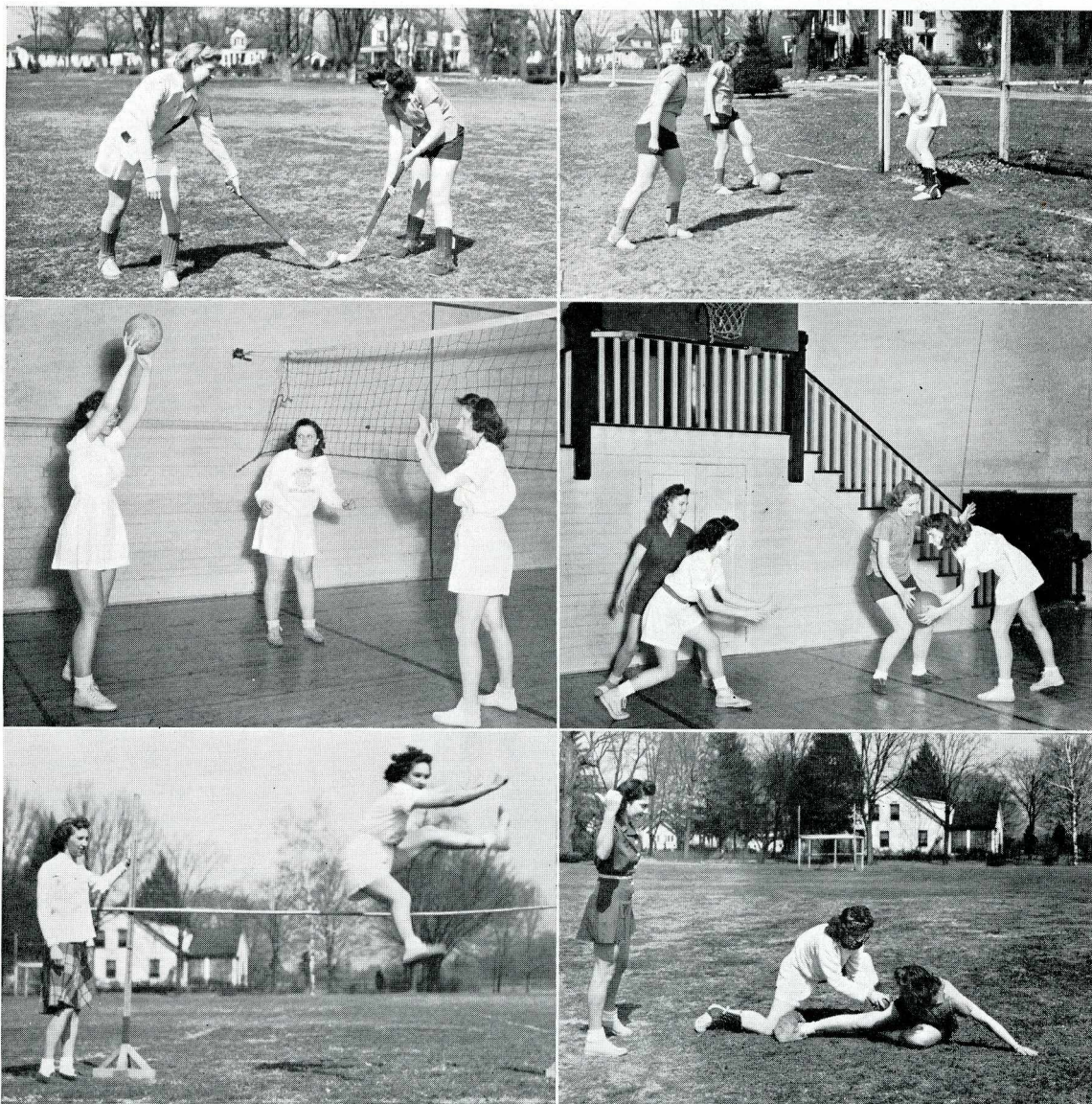
W. A. A. Board

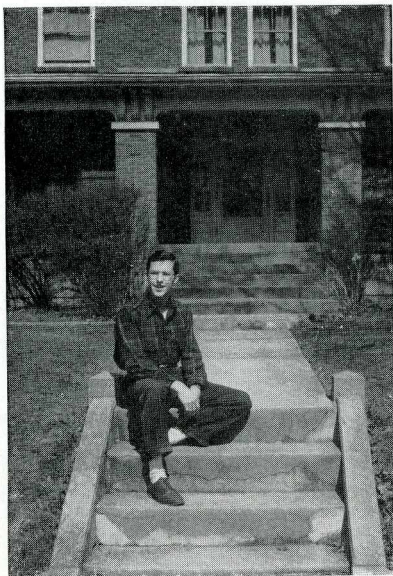

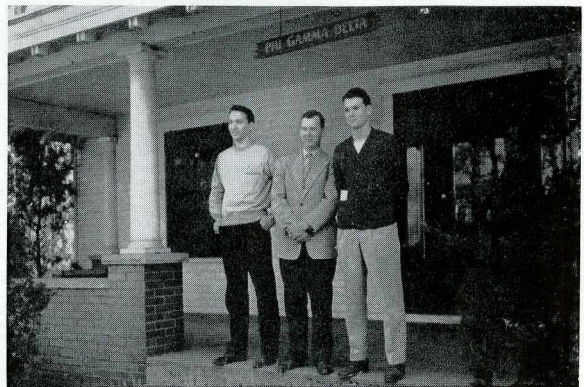

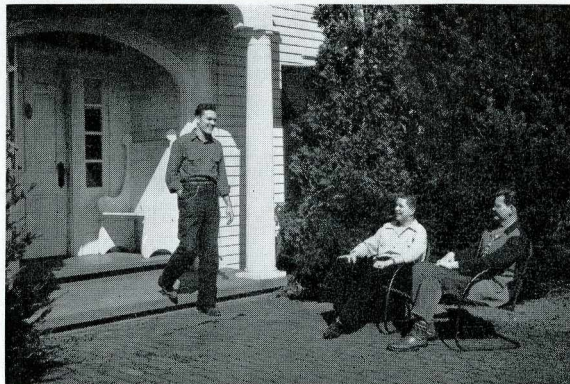
