We will plant some of the plants we bought today and will spend an hour of so on our front porch with one of our daughters and her 19 year old son, who is home from college, with masks, 6 feet apart.

We live about 1 mile from the San Francisco Bay and we can see a bit of it from one of our rooms. We can hear the fog horns at night. Right now the weather is just perfect, sunny and warm enough to be out without a sweater. We live in an old neighborhood, built when ships were being built in Richmond. It is the kind of place that we can expect to see lots of people, single and in family groups, walking their dogs or just walking. Everyone one wears a masks and they are very friendly. That is something that has just happened since the sheltering has taken place. I feel very safe even though I fall into the group that needs to stay sheltered the longest. I pray for the day when I can again, hug my kids and total strangers if I want!

What do you remember best about being on campus in May of other years?

I was a freshman student totally in love with a senior who would be graduating. We had decided to be married that summer. Hanover was just heavenly to me at that point.
