On May, 15, 2022, I got up, and did my morning activities (let my dog Scout out, made coffee, made a health drink, showered and shaved) and then got dressed for church. At church, the adult book group is reading "Jesus and John Wayne, a book which describes how America has gotten to be so divided between political left and the "Christian right" (an excellent book written by Dr. Kristin Kobes Du Mez, a historian who teaches at Calvin College). After church, I went home, had a ham sandwich, read more of the above mentioned book and then took a nap. After the nap, I zoomed a board meeting for Looking Back Moving Forward, a ministry helping helping children and their families in Sierra Leone, and then when to a board meeting at Historic Eleutherian College. At the second meeting, we are working on creating our first Eleutherian Summer Institute, a week long event working with low income students in Indiana who are interested in STEM education. The institute will be June 12 - 18. After the meeting, I came home and made dinner which consisted of cubed steak, smashed potato and salad. After diner, I cleaned up, talked with my mom and after that, a couple friends in the phone, watched 60 Minutes, read some more and just before I was going get ready to go upstairs and read some more, a friend called and asked for help - the goats she is watching while the owner is in California - got out and she couldn't get them back in their paddock. I went over and helped her get them where they were supposed to be. Then I went home and got ready for bed and had one more phone call with a college friend.
