Scope and Content Note

The Abram and Sarah Hendricks collection includes materials related to the Hendricks family of Madison, Jefferson County, Indiana, dated 1836-1887. The collection contains mostly correspondences between Abram and his family, Sarah and her family, as well as their own correspondences, the majority of which take place in the 1850s. Topics discussed include Hendricks family history, religion, college vicissitudes, social customs and 19th century entertainment, law practice, civil war recruitment, travels and vacation, city life, current events, fashion, décor, and marriage.

Historical Information

Sarah Butler Hendricks was born on January 26, 1835 in Madison, Indiana. She was the only child of Ezra Reed Butler and Rebecca Prall Medrum. She attended the Springler Institute in New York City, which was a school for girls and then returned to Madison, IN. On 2 December 1856 she married Abraham W. Hendricks, a young attorney who lived in Madison, IN. Hendricks died on 12 November 1915 in Indianapolis, IN.

Abraham Hendricks was born in Ligonier Valley inside Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania in October 1822. At age 17 he moved to Madison, IN and lived with his uncle William Hendricks. After completing his undergraduate degree at Transylvania University he returned to attend law school and then started his practice in Madison, IN. He formed a law partnership with his cousin Thomas A. Hendricks, who later became Vice President of the United States. During the Civil War he served as a major and was

a quartermaster. After the war he continued law in Indianapolis. Hendricks died 25 November 1887.
